Ashore during the event

The team ashore could also play an important "navigator" role. This team could then, under the guidance of an instructor or teacher, analyze the weather conditions and transmit this information to the team at sea. Info and photos taken that are sent to communicate the team's findings could serve as teaching material in different classes.

At sea during the event and under the leadership of the skipper

The main sailing activity is intended to be an experience of initiation, training, and taking ownership by beginners (or non beginners alike) in the activities onboard the yachts. Rather than being a passive ride, it is an activity where the participants themselves take the active role in operating the vessels. In addition, they will be called to:

- decode both electronic and paper marine charts;
- take into account movement parameters (boat/wind/time);
- orient themselves using a compass ;
- respect the itinerary and the time allotted;
- participate in meal preparation, in cleaning responsibilities and in setting up a system of internal organization specific to each crew.

Crews

Each team will be composed of either 6 or 7 students, preferably from the same school under the command of a skipper and a coskipper. Both will ideally be teachers, members of the school community (psychologist, nurse, secretary, manager...) or parents.

The skipper must have a valid permit and sufficient sailing experience (supported by a resumé). The co-skipper doesn't need any sailing experience. However, if a skipper and a co-skipper are not available within the educational establishment, they will be provided by the event organizer.

When

From Friday April 12th through Friday April 19th.

For those departing from Luxembourg : on Friday April 12th our private chartered flight will take off from Findel airport at 18 :05.

On Friday, April 19th, we will be leaving for Zadar airport; take-off at 20:35 for an expected arrival in Luxembourg around 22:30. The definitive timetables will be posted on our website and also listed in the skipper's book.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

The registration of a school team will be taken into account upon the receipt of a dossier including;

- the completed crewlist;
- transfer of €330,- representing about 45% of the participation fee, transport included.

In case one of these two elements is missing, the boat will not be reserved for the crew but will be maintained in the fleet, available for any other crew coming to register.

Deadline for registering crews is set at Friday December 21st, 2018. If upon this date there is an insufficient number of registered crews, the "European School's Cup" will be cancelled and the money already sent will be refunded.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The registered teams will be formed of either 6 or 7 students. They should be regular students of their establishment (secondary schools, colleges or vocational schools, public or private), but should not be studying at a post-baccalaureate level. The only other requirement is that the person be under 19 years old.

Any exemptions from the rules set out above may be granted on a case-by- case basis.

The students may be accompanied by an adult supervisor (teacher, guidance counselor, parent ...) who will be the spokesperson for the school and assume the supervision of the entire team on behalf of the Principal or Headmaster of the educational establishment, together with the skipper.

All skippers must be covered by a third party skipper's liability insurance.

The schools will participate with a boat made available to them by the event organizer.

Participants' meals are pre-organized, from dinner on the night of arrival through to lunch on the day of departure.

This includes provisions for breakfasts, lunches, snacks and drinks and 5 dinners on the boats, as well as two dinners in restaurant.

Accommodation will be on board the sailboats; bedsheets will be provided.

In compliance with Luxembourgish law, the "European Schools' cup" informs all teams that it retains the right to publish all images taken during the event within different media, including its website.

Sailing Passion bought the damage waiver for the whole flotilla. Therefore, no deposit is required from the skippers.

For the full set of services included (tuition, organization of the event, jury, event committee, ranking, meals, provisioning, transporation) each team must pay the remaining amount due by the 15^{th} of March, 2019, at the latest.

RULES

The "European Schools' cup" is a sailing event governed by the rules of Sailing Passion A.S.B.L., the rules of the ISAF, and the rules of the "Fédération Française de Voile", and is compliant with the class of sailboat being used.

The "European Schools' cup" will involve only one general classification.

Advertisements such as schools' and sponsors' flags and stickers will be authorized.



The "European School's Cup" will be open to crews made up of a maximum of 8 students, belonging to the same school. One adult will be the skipper and the other adult will be a parent or a member of school staff acting as co-skipper.

The adult, supervising the crew, will assist in the smooth and successful running of the "European Schools' cup" on land as well as on the water. He/She/They must ensure that his/her/their crew respects rule 69 of the ISAF concerning the behavior of sailors (allegation of misconduct).

Reminder: this rule applies from registration through to the end of the event, both on land and on water.

The organization of the "European Schools' Cup" reserves the right to exclude from this event and / or future events, any crew or any person who undermines the proper conduct, or the image of the "European Schools' cup".

According to Article 24 of the Grand Ducal Regulation (amended 23 December 2004) regarding internal order and discipline, the consumption of alcohol during the event will not be tolerated. Sailing Passion reserves the right to cancel all courses in the program for the crew at fault. This also applies to adult students.

MEETINGS

In Luxembourg, two meetings are planned :

MANNING OF THE SAILING VESSELS

The differences between the manning and the rigging available for each sailboat will be counterbalanced by a handicap.

The boats are all equipped to comply with the highest standard of safety equipment onboard.

Two dodgers, identifying each yacht, will be distributed to each crew. They remain the property of the organizer to whom they must be returned rinsed and dried, at the end of the event.
